Nebraska Energy Federal Credit Union, (NEFCU) will award twenty-one (21) \$1,000 scholarships to NEFCU members who plan to attend an accredited university, college, junior college, vocational or business school in 2023/2024.

### **ELIGIBILITY**

- 1. Applicant must have an established membership with the credit union. The account must be in their name and under their social security number.
- 2. Member must be in good standing.
- 3. If selected, applicants must provide transcript reflecting a "C" average or higher through the end of the most recent semester.
- 4. Previous recipients of the NEFCU scholarship are ineligible for future scholarship awards.
- 5. Immediate family members of NEFCU staff and volunteers are not eligible. Immediate family includes spouse, children, stepchildren, brothers, sisters, half-brothers, half-sisters, parents, stepparents, stepsiblings, adoptions.

- 1. Applicant must complete and sign an official scholarship application.
- 2. Applicant must submit a typed personal essay as described within the application (maximum 600 words).

### **JUDGING**

- 1. Judging is completed by a panel of impartial professionals in post-secondary education who are not associated with the NEFCU Board, Management or Staff. Applications are submitted by number and judged anonymously.
- 2. Points will be awarded in each of the following areas:
  - Extracurricular Activities and Employment 25 points
  - ➤ Personal Achievement 25 points
  - Personal Essay 50 points
  - Credit Union Service Usage 10 points for each service used: Services include: Savings, Checking, Loans, Credit Card, Debit Card

- 2. Scholarship funds will be paid directly to the institution and the recipient.
